SERVICE

As a National Service Fraternity, Alpha Phi Omega is the only national fraternity with service as its primary mission. While there is a great diversity in the types of service programs conducted from chapter to chapter, they all serve to make up a great national effort to address human needs, conducted exclusively by college students.



Alpha Phi Omega's four-field service program includes service to campus, community, nation, and members (through Leadership Development).

In an effort to make a nationwide impact, APO has developed three significant campaigns; 1) each APO National Convention adopts a Program of Emphasis for the following two years. All chapters are encouraged to develop service projects that will benefit the designated groups; 2) we have designated the first full week in November as National Service Week, and 3) the third weekend of April is National Spring Youth Service Weekend in conjunction with Youth Service America, during which chapters are encouraged to conduct youth-focused service projects on their campus and in their community.
